A *nation* is a piece of land on earth which should have its own unique identity. It could be cultural, ethnic etc. If it is a *sovereign nation (country)*, then it should have its own government which should be independent. Commonwealth Realms are an exception as they are sovereign nations but still have H.M. as their monarch who is above the law.

Nationality is the practically a contract between a person and a nation or a country. The person will pay allegiance (be a good citizen) to a nation and the nation will protect his or her rights. In case your nation is not worth your nationality, you can change it by gaining or buying citizenship of another country.

Nationalism is a feeling. A person generally gets a feeling of *nationalism* when his or her country has the birthday or coronation day of the nation's monarch. For people living in democratic countries, it's generally their independence day which arouses the feeling of *nationalism*. That competition could be a friendly cricket match or a struggle for freedom. An extreme form of *nationalism* is marked by a feeling of superiority over other countries.
